Article 63 - Prohibition of Possession, etc., of Firearm by Certain Persons

1. Lifetime and Temporary Prohibition

- A person convicted of a crime and sentenced to imprisonment or detention in a young offenders' centre for 3 years or more is prohibited for life from purchasing, acquiring, or possessing a firearm or ammunition.
- If the sentence is **between 3 months and less than 3 years**, the prohibition lasts **8 years**.
- A person sentenced to detention during the pleasure of the Secretary of State under Article
 45(1) of the Criminal Justice (Children) (Northern Ireland) Order 1998 is also prohibited for
 life.
- This prohibition **takes effect from the date of conviction**, including cases where the sentence is suspended.

2. Additional Prohibited Persons

- A person under a recognizance to keep the peace, a probation order restricting firearm
 possession, or a licence under Article 46 of the Criminal Justice (Children) (Northern
 Ireland) Order 1998 must not purchase, acquire, or possess firearms or ammunition.
- Any person prohibited under Section 21 of the Firearms Act 1968 in Great Britain is also prohibited in Northern Ireland.

3. Scope of Prohibition

• Prohibited persons may not possess any firearms or ammunition, including those not requiring a certificate, such as air guns and air gun pellets.

4. Offences and Penalties

- It is an **offence** to violate any provision of this article.
- It is also an **offence to sell, transfer, repair, or test** firearms or ammunition for a prohibited person.

5. Application for Prohibition Removal

- Article 63(6) allows a prohibited person to apply to the Secretary of State for removal of the prohibition.
- Under the Firearms (Appeals and Applications) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2005, an application should include:
 - A written notice to the Secretary of State (form available at any police station or from the Firearms and Explosives Branch of the NIO).
 - A statement outlining each ground for the application.
 - o The application may be submitted **at any time**.

6. Consideration by the Secretary of State

- Applications are considered on a case-by-case basis, but:
 - For 8-year prohibitions, removal is not usually granted unless there are exceptional circumstances.

o For **lifetime prohibitions**, removal is not usually granted **within 15 years** of release unless there are **exceptional circumstances**.
